Canopy Forum is seeking written submissions exploring the intersection of law, religion, and public health in light of ongoing concerns over **COVID-19** and the legal, ethical, and religious questions raised by the virus itself and the public health responses to the virus: quarantine, triaging resources, hoarding supplies, balancing concerns for avoiding public panic and candor about risks, etc.

Submissions should be between 1,250-1,500 words (though longer pieces may be considered) and written in a generally accessible style; relying on embedded links more than footnotes for supporting materials and references.

Submissions and further inquiries should be sent to canopyforum@emory.edu, and will be considered for publication on a rolling basis as events continue to unfold in connection with the spread and treatment of the **COVID-19** virus.
