ABOUT THIS JOURNAL

Quaderni di diritto e politica ecclesiastica publishes articles on all aspects of law, religion, and policy in Italy and abroad. It is published four times a year and each issue has a specific focus. Issue no. 1 is a monographic volume collecting scholarly articles on a topic of interest to the law and religion field. Issue no. 2 publishes comments to the year's most relevant documents of Ecclesiastical law and policy, along with analyses of emerging trends and book reviews. It also includes a miscellaneous section where a range of articles drawn from various sectors of the law and religion field are published. TOPIC

The issue of identity has been investigated for centuries by Western thought in relation with otherness and difference. In the past years, it has revolved around migrations as well as social, cultural, sex and gender movements which have led to claims for new identities and belongings. On the one hand, these claims impact on citizenship and rights but, on the other hand, they challenge legal systems pressed between the protection of religious and cultural heritage and societal evolution.

This year's call for paper invites to reflect on these processes in order to investigate their impact on the relationships amongst religions, identity and citizenship, or between legal systems on the one hand and religious identity and belonging on the other hand. We welcome contributions on this topic, but we specify that we will not consider for publication articles focusing on case law. Interested authors are kindly invited to note that case law is the specific object of issue no. 3 of this journal.

SUBMISSIONS

The editorial committee will only consider for publication articles which have not been and will not be published elsewhere (in any format), and which comply with the journal's style guidelines. Interested authors are kindly invited to use the attached file "Style model". Only articles of maximum 15 pages will be accepted.

The editorial committee welcomes articles in Italian, English, French and Spanish. Authors submitting an article in a language different from their mother tongue are responsible for any language review that may be necessary.

Interested authors are invited to send their article in .doc format to redazione.qdpe2@gmail.com no later than 30 April 2021. All articles will be subject to blind peer-review and authors will be notified of the reviewer's recommendation (accepted / accepted subject to change / rejected). Accepted articles will be published in the section "Contributions of the call for papers «Religions, identity and citizenship»" of issue no. 2 of the journal, which will be published in October 2021 in both print and online versions.

Times New Roman 10, justified. Leave one blank line below.

1. *Title of the section*: Times New Roman 12, italics, justified, no indentation. Leave one blank line below.

1.1. *Title of the sub-section (if any)*: Times New Roman 12, italics, justified, no indentation. Leave one blank line below.

Text: Times New Roman 12, justified, 1.25 cm indent, single spacing.

Words in CAPITAL LETTERS, SMALL CAPITALS, **bold**, underlined or other variations may not be used in either the text or the footnotes.

References must be in-text citations following the *Chicago Manual of Style*. Examples: (Ferrari 1980); (Ferrari 1980, 25-26). Footnotes may be used only for comments or primary sources.

At the end of the article, please write the following information in Times New Roman 12, italics, justified, single spacing:

Author's name(s) and surname(s)

Affiliation (department and university)

Postal address of the institution of affiliation

Author's e-mail address

References: Times New Roman 12, justified, 1.25 cm hanging indentation, single spacing. References should be listed alphabetically and, for each author, chronologically. Use the *Chicago Manual of Style*. Kindly note that the strict respect for these style rules is a pre-condition for acceptance of any submitted article. Examples:
